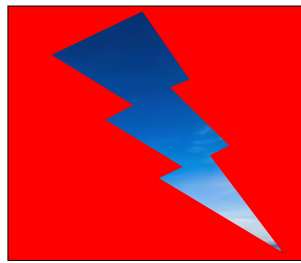

Thank you to the teachers and others who made the day possible.

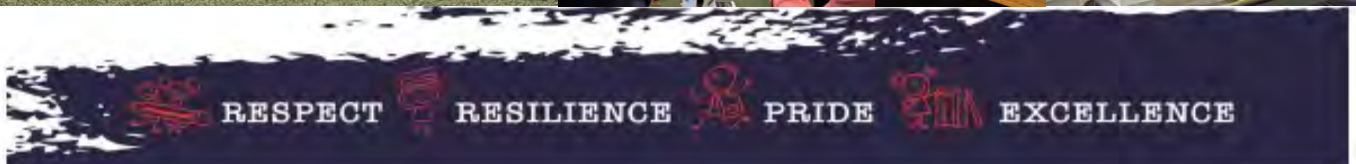
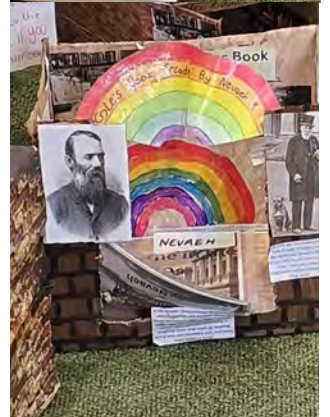
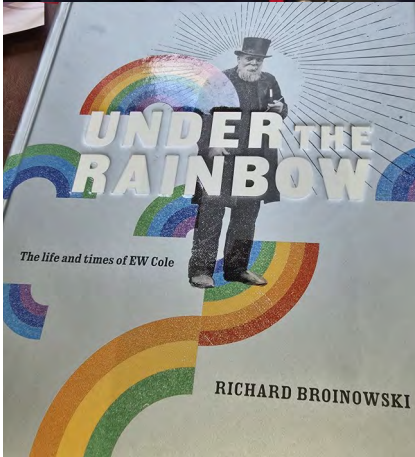
A special congratulations to Harry (AFL), Nevaeh (Netball) and Sabeen (Netball) who have been selected to compete in their chosen sports at a divisional level.

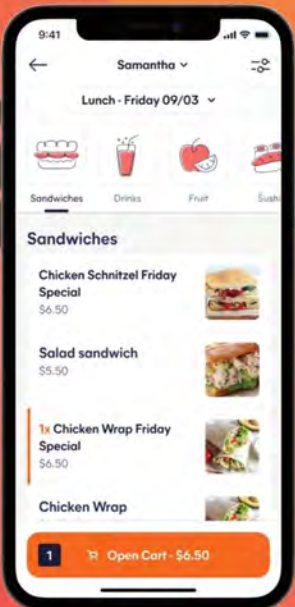
