FREE INSTRUCTION

Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.

Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other

Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.

Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.





This is another of the 3-ingredient recipes being made by students in OSHC during term 2 in their 'Tasty Tuesday' sessions.

Cloud Bread

Light and fluffy bread which is low-carb alternative to regular bread made with only 3 ingredients.



As made by Evie in OSHC 24/6/2025

3 Eggs

1/4 tsp Cream of Tartar

3 Tablespoons Cream Cheese, softened (or Yoghurt)

- 1. Preheat oven to 150C.
- 2. Separate Eggs into 2 bowls.
- 3. Add Cream of Tartar to the Egg Whites and whip into stiff peaks.
- Add the Cream Cheese into the yolks and mix until combined. 4.
- 5. Fold half of the Egg White mixture into the yolks until it is just combined.
- Fold in—very gently—the rest of the Egg Whites until just combined. 6.
- 7. Line a baking sheet with baking paper and place six dollops of the mixture on the tray.
- 8. Spread out the circles with a spatula until about 1 cm thick.
- 9. Bake until golden—about 30 minutes.
- 10. Allow to cool for at least 1 hour
- 11. Enjoy!
